1 Corinthians 8:1–13

¹Concerning food offered to idols: we know that “all of us possess knowledge.” This “knowledge” puffs up, but love builds up. ²If anyone imagines that he knows something, he does not yet know as he ought to know. ³But if anyone loves God, he is known by God.

⁴Therefore, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that “an idol has no real existence,” and that “there is no God but one.” ⁵For although there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as indeed there are many “gods” and many “lords”—⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

⁷However, not all possess this knowledge. But some, through former association with idols, eat food as really offered to an idol, and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. ⁸Food will not commend us to God. We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. ⁹But take care that this right of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰For if anyone sees you who have knowledge eating in an idol’s temple, will he not be encouraged, if his conscience is weak, to eat food offered to idols? ¹¹And so by your knowledge this weak person is destroyed, the brother for whom Christ died. ¹²Thus, sinning against your brothers and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³Therefore, if food makes my brother stumble, I will never eat meat, lest I make my brother stumble.

The Exorcism of a Demon Possessed Man

A Meditation Upon the Word of God | Mark 1:21-28

The demon was content to remain hidden until Jesus speaks. Why? Here is the answer. There is nothing more that agitates Satan and his minions than the preaching of the Gospel. There is nothing that incites him to rage or stirs him up to wrath, than when the Word of God is taught in its truth and purity, and we as the children of God lead holy lives according to it. Nothing is more repulsive and repugnant to the devil than this word of forgiveness and peace. Satan is jealous of God. Remember, he is the Prince of this world. The world is his oyster.

At one time, we were all in his kingdom, in his bondage. But then God spoke this word of forgiveness and joined it to Baptism-water. And by this word of forgiveness joined to the water, God stole us back from the devil. And Satan hates this. Satan wants to destroy your faith in Christ, above all things. Because he wants you in his kingdom. He wants you to suffer with him in hell. Misery loves company. But when the Gospel is preached your faith is sustained. And when the Word is taught and believed, the temptations and assaults of the devil are repulsed.

So here's why the demon choose this particular place and time and moment to rage. Because Jesus speaks a word that silences him, that muzzles him, that literally shuts him up. That's what the Greek says. "Shut up." The devil has a word too. He wants to speak too. And his word against you is that you are sinner, that you should die for your sin and be condemned. But the Word of Gospel muzzles the devil and closes his gaping mouth. Why? The Gospel exposes the devil's word as a lie. For the Gospel says, your sin has been taken—the punishment you deserved for sin has been answered for in the blood of Jesus Christ. And now, there is no one left to accuse you, up to and including the great Accuser of believers in Christ, the devil.

This is the reason the Son of God appeared: to destroy the works of the devil. And at the cross, that is where that happened. The cross is where Satan's head was crushed. Because there are the cross ran the blood that atones, that answers for sin. All your sins are paid for in the death of Jesus. And there is nothing left to do now, but go and tell the world, go and spread this word of forgiveness to every nation. So the demon cries out when Jesus shows up. Because where the kingdom of God advances, the kingdom of the devil is rolled back.
