The Divine Service

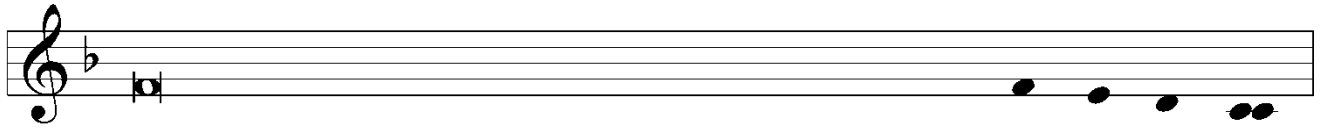

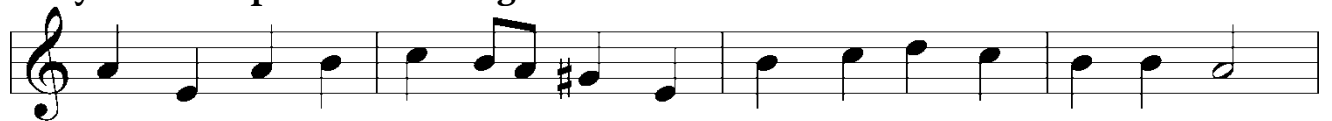

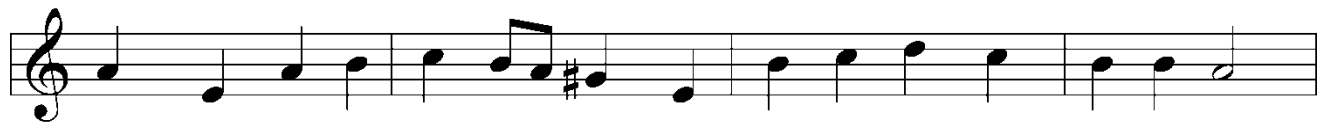

Luke 20:9–20

The Parable of the Wicked Tenants

There is a vineyard owner, who is God. His vineyard is Israel. There are farmers whom the vineyard owner hires to work in his absence as he goes away. The farmers are the religious leaders of Israel. And the servants whom the vineyard owner sends to collect the fruit of the vineyard are the prophets, whom God sends again and again into Israel to call the people to repentance. But the most striking feature is that after all these servants are killed, and before the Vineyard Owner makes the determination that he will destroy these tenants, take the vineyard from them and give it to others, he says, “*What shall I do? I will send my beloved Son.*”

It’s also important that we know *when* Jesus is speaking this parable. Jesus is close to the cross and the empty tomb. It’s Tuesday of Holy Week. Jesus is in the temple teaching. He had just come into the Holy City, two days before, in the Triumphal entry on Palm Sunday. He is teaching the crowds in the temple courtyard only a few days before his death. But the religious leaders of the people of Israel—the Chief Priests and Scribes—are also there, listening in, with hostile intentions. And he tells the Parable of the Wicked Tenants specifically against them. It is, for them, a Parable of Law, because these religious leaders are the very wicked tenants in the parable who soon, would reject, throw out, and kills the Vineyard Owner’s Son.

The irony is this very Parable is self-fulfilling prophecy. It is the thing that causes them go and do what Jesus said they would do. It says in verse 19, “*They sought to lay hands on him at that very hour, because they perceived that he had told this parable against them.*” They knew what Jesus meant. They knew they were the bad guys in the story, the wicked tenants, who soon, would fall under God’s judgment. They stood in a long line of religious leaders who killed the prophets, and who would finally kill the Son. So again, the religious leaders know they are the targets in this parable. The story itself, is one of the main things that causes them to hate Jesus, and seek his life in the days that are about to follow. Again, it is for them, this Parable is Law, Judgment. But it is important that we know it is not only a Parable of Law and Judgment. And, it is not even *mainly* a Parable of Law and Judgment. It is a Parable of God’s grace.

Fundamentally, this Parable is not about the wicked tenants. It’s about the Vineyard Owner. A Vineyard Owner who has a vineyard that he loves, that he provides for, that he will never give up, whatever the cost. What’s the surprise in this parable? You wouldn’t send another servant, and then another. That would be foolish. You’ve heard the phrase, fool me once, shame on you. Fool me twice, shame on me. This owner allows himself to be fooled, again and again, until he sends his dearest treasure, his beloved Son, whom he has to know will meet the same fate as all of the servants who went before him. And when the Son is cast out of the vineyard and killed, that is a picture of Christ’s crucifixion and death which takes place outside the city walls of Jerusalem. But then Jesus quotes Psalm 118, “*The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.*” This is Christ’s resurrection, his exaltation, his ascension where he is reigning at the right hand of the Father. God will build his Church on Christ’s saving death. He will make Christ’s sacrifice on the cross the foundation of saving faith. If this Stone falls on you on the Last Day, it will crush you eternally. If, however, you fall on this Stone now and are broken to pieces in contrition and humble faith in Jesus, your heavenly Father will make you a living stone to be eternally built upon the Rock who is Christ.
